## 1. Description

The Thesis Workshop is meant to provide MA and ReMA students working on related topics in phenomenology and continental philosophy a platform to develop their theses in a supportive and collaborative environment. Each session will last two hours, and it will be devoted to a specific topic, which is, in turn, either directly or indirectly connected to at least one thesis proposal. Part of each session will also be reserved for questions on formal aspects of MA and ReMA theses, as well as other general questions.

In addition to the sessions already planned, students will have the possibility to schedule one or more other sessions to present their works, or to discuss a text together, especially if the text is considered of collective interest.

Note that participating in the workshop is not mandatory, and that it does not replace individual meetings with the thesis advisor. During individual meetings students will have the chance to discuss previously submitted pieces of writing, as well as to receive guidance on their readings. Students are encouraged to send a piece of writing or a set of questions before any individual meeting to get the most out of this opportunity.
